

Speaker Descriptions

Day 1

Charles Rosen - Ironbound Cider and Farm

Opening Keynote

Growers who embrace the full range of environmental, social, and cultural benefits envisioned by the earliest organic pioneers cannot survive in the winner-take-all economy where price and convenience rule. Instead of joining in that race to the bottom, Charles Rosen, owner of Ironbound Farm, believes we can build an alternative local food marketplace that is decentralized, inclusive, human-scaled, and tailored to local resources and needs. Join him for a discussion on the perspective and storytelling skills needed to inspire new and existing customers to support the benefits that organic farming brings to our state.

Nate Kleinman - Experiemental Farming Nerwork

Nate Kleinman, co-founder of the Experimental Farm Network, will discuss the vital importance of preserving and expanding crop diversity, with a focus on what each of us as farmers and gardeners can do to participate in this critical effort. Topics will include habitat preservation and crop wild relatives, government seed banks and other collections, cultural stewardship of seeds, corporate consolidation and loss of commercial varieties, and practical ways to increase genetic diversity in the seed supply. In the face of climate change and ecological collapse, this is an important discussion for all of us.

Rowen White - Sierra Seeds

Keynote

Rowen White is a seed keeper from the Mohawk community of Akwesasne and is an advocate for Indigenous seed sovereignty, and she will talk about the important connections between seeds and people. She will speak about the intergenerational nature of her work, cultivating intimacy with food, cultivating ancestral connection through seed saving, the stories of seeds, and ways of healing historical trauma.

Farming Roundtable

Nate Kleinman will lead a roundtable discussion about urban farming and food justice in New Jersey with some of the inspiring activist farmers of the Garden State.

Organic Seed Companies and Resources Exchange

Hosted by Mike Rassweiller, this hour will feature information from Nate Kleinman from Experimental Farming Network; Marcello Mangano Director of Lab and Alexandra Villiard from the New Jersey Beneficial Insect Lab; Laura Goldshein from High Mowing Seeds; Heron Breen from Fedco Seeds; and Laura Robertson from NOFA-NJ on our new Resource Library.

Kendrya Close - Food Shed Alliance

Rural-Urban Partnerships: Connecting the Food System Dots in NJ

Learn how creating and strengthening rural-urban partnerships in New Jersey is rebuilding our local food system: providing affordable land-lease opportunities on preserved farmland to new and emerging organic growers, especially from socially disadvantaged communities; rebuilding distribution infrastructure via a food hub to connect urban and rural growers with population-dense communities, and capturing surplus food grown on farms for distribution to those in need.

Senator Cory Booker

Closing Keynote

Senator Cory Booker will be speaking about three of his agriculture-related pieces of legislation: the Justice for Black Farmers Act, the Climate Stewardship Act, and the Farm System Reform Act, as well as what inspired him to be so active on food and farm policy.

Speaker Descriptions



Dave Robinson - Rutgers University

The Earth's climate system is changing on local to global scales. Professor & New Jersey State Climatologist Dave Robinson will discuss why this change of climate is occurring, and what the foreseeable future holds on the Garden State situation.

Jacqueline Ricotta - Deleware Valley University

Dr. Jacqueline Ricotta will discuss what tools, information and inspiration are available to help farmers adapt to climate changes.

Chris Smaje - Author

Chris Smaje draws on his new book A *Small Farm Future* to explain how farming and gardening scaled to local needs using primarily organic and regenerative techniques can help address our seemingly intractable contemporary crises of environment and society. There are no panaceas, but Chris will describe how building concepts of individual and community self-reliance, commons, social justice, and politics-from-below might enable us to create small farm societies equal to the present challenges we face.

Eric Toensmeier - Author

Agriculture and land use are the source of over 20% of human greenhouse gas emissions. Many practices reduce these emissions. In addition many practices remove excess atmospheric carbon dioxide and sequester (store) it in soil organic matter and the biomass of perennial plants. We will walk through an overview of these practices and their potential, with a special eye towards those that are suited to the mid-Atlantic climate and farming systems.

Daniel Mays - Frith Farm

Daniel will present an overview of his farm's no-till practices, including: permanent raised beds, use of compost and mulches, tarping, cover cropping, in-situ mulching, interplanting, and maintaining a weed-free farm. Come learn the ecological, economic, and human benefits of farming without tractors, tillage, or pesticides!

Journey Person Roundtable

Join the NOFA-NJ 2020 Journey Persons and their mentors, to hear about their Journey's in NJ Organic Agriculture. NOFA-NJ pairs JourneyPerson Farmers with Mentors, each year, to provide support, networking, and technical assistance. We will discuss the Application Process, hear from each of the 2020 Journey Persons, and talk about mentoring in general.

Mike Rassweiler - North Slope Farm, NOFA-NJ President

2020 was an exceptional year and Local Organic Producers were correctly identified as "Critical Workers." Our Farmers quickly adapted to developing Health Protocols and created many new ways for customers to maintain access to fresh, quality food. The Challenges remain, but NJ Organic Farmers have proven their critical value to our community. As we plan for the future, we want to bring in New Farmers, Get more Land into Organic Management Systems, and keep Local Healthy food as a top priority!



Rowen is the current National Project Coordinator and advisor for the Indigenous Seed Keeper Network, an initiative of the Native American Food Sovereignty Alliance, a non-profit organization aimed at leveraging resources to support tribal food sovereignty projects. The mission of the Indigenous Seed Keepers Network is to nourish and assist the growing Seed Sovereignty Movement across Turtle Island. Her passion being in teaching and mentoring, Rowen has developed many curricula that focus on holistic, indigenous permaculture based approach to seed stewardship which honors the many layers of seed culture. She weaves stories of seeds, food, culture and sacred Earth stewardship on her blog, Seed Songs.

CHARLES ROSEN - IRONBOUND FARMS

Charles Rosen is the founder and CEO of Ironbound Hard Cider and New Ark Farms, a Newark-based social enterprise focused on workforce development and regenerative agriculture. New Ark Farm commits to providing living wages to ex-offenders and underserved members of the Greater Newark community to educate their employees in identity value, conflict resolutions, and communication skills. By creating a curriculum surrounding these soft-skills, Charles believes that this will create a more welcoming work environment, and arm his employees with tools needed to better serve the community.

NATHAN KLEINMAN - EXPERIEMENTAL FARM NETWORK

Philadelphia native Nate Kleinman has done various types of work, mainly in politics and organizing, but happily quit his last "real job" in 2012 to focus on non-profit work and activism. He has been involved in efforts including the Sudan Freedom Walk, Witness for Peace, Occupy Wall Street, Occupy Sandy, and the Movement for Black Lives. Nate serves on the Executive Board of the Philadelphia Orchard Project and Grassroots Seed Network. He is a member of the Seed Advisory Committee of the Non-GMO Project and the Education Committee of NOFA-NJ. He co-founded the Experimental Farm Network in 2013 to facilitate collaboration on plant breeding and agroecology research. As a plant breeder and researcher, Nate has a broad range of interests but is most engaged in pursuing climate-stabilizing perennial staple crops.



KATHIA RAMIREZ - CATA

Kathia Ramirez born and raised in Aztlan land, Los Angeles CA, but very proud of her Zapotec Indigenous Roots from Oaxaca Mexico, has been part of the CATA team for 6 years, starting as an organizer and now as the Food Justice Coordinator. In her role, Kathia works closely with community members who are interested in bettering our current food system, manages our community gardens in each state we work in, and represents CATA and their members in Alliances at the national level working in solidarity with social movements at the global level to advance Food Sovereignty and Agroecology as an alternative to the current Food System.

PAIGE VACCARO - C.R.O.P.S

Long Island native, Paige Vaccaro holds a B.A. in English from Rutgers University and an M.A. in Elementary Education from Johns Hopkins University. She is a certified teacher and an alumna of Teach for America. After 12 years of teaching in public schools in Baltimore, Brooklyn, Newark, and Ocean Township, NJ, Paige relocated to South Jersey and set out to forge new paths to bridge the gaps between and within communities. In 2016, Paige founded the nonprofit organization Communities Revolutionizing Open Public Spaces (C.R.O.P.S.), which hosts local farmers markets, community gardens, paid internships and educational programming and events, being the only SNAP accessible farmers market in Atlantic County, NJ. C.R.O.P.S. collaborates with local businesses and nonprofit organizations including the Covenant House and the Friends of Jean Webster, Inc. to improve food access and build a culture of connection to the Earth and to one another.

SONYA HARRIS

South Jersey native, Sonya Harris is a former special education teacher of 25 years, believing in learning beyond the four walls of the classroom. Sonya used this philosophy to form the award-winning Bullock Children's Garden at Dorothy L. Bullock Elementary School in Glassboro, NJ in 2015. In 2017, Sonya established the nonprofit The Bullock Garden Project, Inc. to assist teachers and schools to cut through the "red tape" and navigate through the approval system to build school gardens. In 2020, in the face of a global pandemic, Sonya steered the path of The Bullock Garden Project from solely educating others about gardening to joining the movement to help feed those affected by food insecurity & food apartheid worsened with the pandemic. Seeing clips of farmers across the nation till under crops of food they were unable to sell, and hundreds of families standing in food pantry lines for hours in attempts to get some kind of food she mobilized her team, joining as a founding member of the Cooperative Gardens Commission with Nate Kleinman to help. BGP began connecting with local farms to see what foods were available to glean, then donated that food to feed families in need.



JUSTIN ALLEN - ISLES OF TRENTON

Justin has been gardening and working with plants since as early as he can remember, around the age of three. His passion is now in growing food organically. As of January 2017, he began working at Isles, Inc. in Trenton as their Urban Agriculture Coordinator. Prior to that, he had been working for Greater Newark Conservancy first as their Youth Farm Stand Coordinator, then Director of Community Greening, and finally Director of Urban Agriculture. Prior to that, he worked for 5 years with young children on an eighth of an acre garden through HealthBarn USA's healthy lifestyle education program. Justin received an Associate of Arts from Bergen Community College. He also received his Bachelors of Science in Nutritional Science with a concentration in Dietetics, along with a certificate in Food Systems Education and Administration from Rutgers University. Justin has also earned an internationally-recognized Permaculture Design Certificate.





He is an appointed lecturer at Yale University, a Senior Biosequestration Fellow with Project Drawdown, and an international trainer. He has studied useful perennial plants and their roles in agroforestry systems for over two decades. In *The Carbon Farming Solution*, Eric Toensmeier admirably harnesses available data with traditional wisdom to propose a practical response to climate change. Daniel Mays grew up outside of Philadelphia, and while in graduate school for environmental engineering, realized that he wanted to be a farmer. He began his search for land on Maine FarmLink, and was able to buy the farm thanks to a purchased easement negotiated with MFT, the Town of Scarborough, and Scarborough Land Trust. Now, six years later, Daniel has transformed the acreage into a rich and biodiverse farm where he raises organic vegetables and herbs, as well as pasture-raised eggs, chicken, pork, and turkeys

PROF.JACKIE RICOTTA - DELAWARE VALLEY UNIVERSITY

Originally from Rochester, N.Y., Jackie Ricotta graduated from Cornell University and went on to receive a Master's degree from North Carolina State University and a doctorate from the University of Illinois, both in Horticulture, specializing in vegetable production and pest control. As a professor of horticulture at Delaware Valley University, she teaches courses in subjects such as Botany, Sustainable Agriculture, Organic Food & Fiber, and Marketing of Horticultural Products. Jackie was instrumental in bringing certified organic to the university's farm in 2004 and helped start the Organic Farming Certificate program (partnered with the Rodale Institute) as well as the Sustainable Agriculture Systems major. In 2012, she received the DelVal distinguished faculty member award. In addition to being on the board of NOFA-NJ, Jackie is active with the American Society for Horticultural Science, the Pennsylvania Horticultural Society, the Bucks County Foodshed Alliance, Pennsylvania Association for Sustainable Agriculture, and the DelVal Food Systems Institute.



DAVE ROBINSON - NJ STATE CLIMATOLOGIST

An earth scientist, more specifically a physical geographer and climatologist Dave Robinson's research interests run the spatial gamut from global to local, with an underlying theme being the development of a better understanding of the climate system. Majority of his published research focusing on hemispheric and regional snow cover dynamics and the interaction with other climates, aiding in national and international climate assessments. Being the New Jersey State Climatologist, Robinson conducts applied research focusing on the vast weather and climate within the Garden State, such as climate change, drought, flooding, and issues surrounding agriculture, transportation, public safety and commerce. Robinson has served on a number of national committees and occasionally publishes on issues related to his interest in the collection and archiving of accurate climatic data.
